- A member of one of the Greenfield Fire District Auxiliaries will call you to see if you are safe.
- Each participant will receive confirmation of receipt of their application.
- The database will be updated upon participant’s written request or annually.

Register your specific needs in our confidential system, designed to aid our fire, police and emergency medical responders in meeting your individual needs.

2. Confidentiality

The information you provide is confidential and only available to trained volunteers.

3. Call and Contact

During an emergency or disaster a volunteer will call you to be sure that you and your home are safe and secure.

The Program is for People Who May Be:

- Without family nearby
- Hearing impaired
- Vision impaired
- Speech impaired, non-verbal
- Physically disabled
- A senior living independently
- In need of special care should a localized evacuation occur
- Mentally or emotionally disabled
- Medically dependent on electric service for equipment i.e. oxygen

What is the “Are You Okay?” Program?

Neighbors Helping Neighbors

“Are You Okay?”

Is an entirely voluntary program designed to enhance public safety.

All emergencies begin and end locally. In the aftermath of 9-11 officials in the U.S. Department of Homeland Security endorsed local efforts to assist residents in obtaining emergency services.

“Are You Okay?”

Provides personalized and confidential information through a Town system to local Fire, Police and EMS. This enables Emergency Services to respond appropriately to those residents requiring special consideration.
