Greenfield Opens Hometown Ambulance Service

Greenfield now has 24/7 emergency medical services, right from the center of town. Through a partnership with Corinth EMS, we now will have quicker response times. Our team of EMTs will help protect our residents in a health crisis and provide community health service support to local events. You can see our newly renovated facility across the street from the Greenfield Fire Department, as well as our new ambulance and first response vehicle.



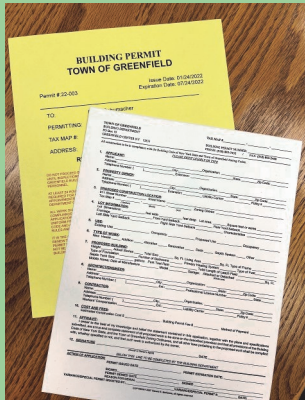

Town-Wide Clean Up

Do some spring cleaning and drop your items off at the Highway Department Garage at 409 Bockes Rd. on May 13 -15, 7 a.m.-3 p.m.

Get rid of household items, furniture, light scrap metal, paint cans (empty clean and dry), computer and electronics. No household trash.

You must have a TOWN RESIDENT CARD, which can be picked up at Town Hall with a driver's license and utility bill.



Pick up a building permit application at Town Hall. We'd rather be your Building Inspector than your Code Enforcement Officer.

From the "Hub" of Town Hall: Clerk Louise Okoniewski

The Town Clerk's office is an important position at the center of our town government. The clerk is a public servant who serves as the Records Management Officer, responsible for filing the documents vital to the townspeople.

Visit Louise to receive your licenses for marriage, dogs, fishing and hunting. The clerk attends all Town Board meetings and takes meet-

ing minutes, which are available for the public online. She administers Oaths of Office, and notifies the public of all appointments, vacancies and resignations. The clerk also collects our residents' taxes each year.

Deputy Clerk Karen Downen assists with all the clerk's many duties.

Town Clerk Hours: M-TR 8:30 a.m.- 3 p.m., Friday 8 a.m.-3 p.m. or by appointment.

Has Your Building Permit Expired?

If warmer weather has you back on track with your home improvement projects, or even if you've been in construction all winter, please keep an eye on your permit expiration date. It is the responsibility of all building permit holders to renew your building permit before it expires. If

not renewed, it becomes a Code Enforcement Case for administrative review and action.

APRIL IS Code Compliance and Enforcement Month!

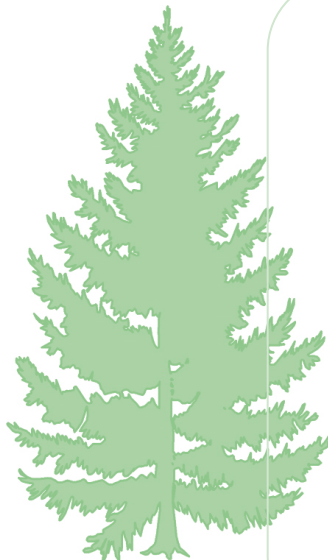
We will be enforcing the Property Maintenance Code of the NYS Uniform

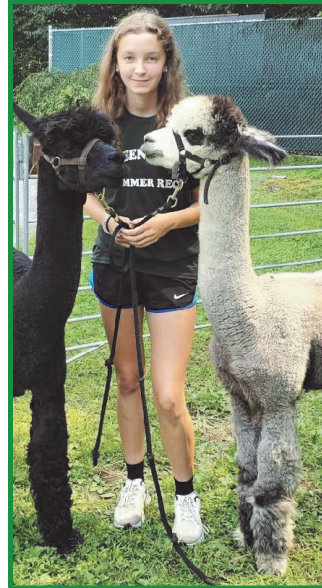
