Prior to joining Industrial Performance, Sean had many years of experience in hospitality. Growing up with parents that owned restaurants, he started working in the industry at 12 years old. Performance Industrial Sean got the itch to dive back into the hospitality industry. Bill suggested they team up and that's when they found Tinney's. "It has a great community following so it was really a no brainer to try and go after it," explained Sean.

The four owners have been working hard to prepare for the reopening of such a beloved restaurant. They have added fresh paint, new lighting, and an additional television. However, their goal is to preserve the already well-established tavern. They plan on reintroducing as many of Tinney's events as possible and continue to welcome loyal guests as well as bring new people to the restaurant.
