Winter Reminders From Code Enforcement and Highway

Please have your chimneys cleaned to avoid a home fire. Chimney cleaning can cost approximately \$100 and save your lives and homes from extensive damage.

Please remember to keep your home vents cleared from snow drifts after a big snow. Blocked furnace and other vents can cause carbon monoxide poisoning.





Help out our Highway Department snow plow crew by:

- Not plowing snow from your property into the roadways.
- Place trash receptacles in your cleaned driveway or up on to your property so they are not buried by the plow.
- You should never park cars in the road in the winter, as they can be towed. (It's the law! Thank you.)

Ensure Your Address is Visible for Emergency Response

Is your home address properly marked from the street?

In an emergency, seconds count. Your address needs to be obvious for police, ambulances and fire trucks. A clear address can help them get to you quickly.

Find the Right Place
If your mailbox cannot
be viewed from the
road or if you use a PO
Box, display your
address on a
monument, pole or
other structure where it
can be seen.

Rural Considerations

GPS might not always pinpoint your home. In our town, there are homes that are at the end of private, unmarked access roads that could be hard to find.

A Quick Fix

Address display kits are an easy and affordable way to ensure your home is locatable.

New Construction

Plan for clear address identification, per the New York State Fire Code. You should consider a conversation

with our 911 coordinator (in the Assessor's Office) to be sure you are using the right number for your address.

Stay safe

Make sure your address is easy to spot to help emergency services get to you when you need them most.

The Dynamic TOG Duo: From Campers to Camp Directors

TOG Camp is loaded with all the rural, small-town vibes. New this year, the camp will be led by two Greenfield natives, Liz Pratt and Maddy Chandler, who will serve as camp directors.

Liz Pratt and Maddy Chandler spent their childhood as campers, more than 8 years working for the camp and even more years as friends. After working as directors in training for the past two summers, they will now run the show.

Pratt graduated from SUNY Cortland in 2023 with a degree in chemistry and is now working on a master's degree in middle school science and high school chemistry education. Chandler recently graduated from the College of St. Rose with an elementary education and special education degree as well as a master's in literacy. They are both subbing at schools in the area.

Pratt was a field hockey star from Saratoga, her team winning back to back sectional championships. At Cortland, her team was 2X SUNYAC conference championships. She was captain for two of those years and the team made it to the sweet sixteen in her last season. Chandler was an all-star softball player at Saratoga. In college she earned first-team all conference awards for multiple years and "female athlete of the year" in 2023.

Pratt said her fondest memories of TOG camp are still the big hits for campers today from a trip to the Saratoga County Fair to bowling and swimming at Peerless Pool. "Maddy and I were always buddied up in the same group," she recalled.

"It is amazing to be able to work with your childhood friends while serving as a role model and positive influence to the kids," she said. "It is very fulfilling to give them something special to remember."

Chandler added "Our tight-knit community is what makes our camp different. Every year, we see the same familiar faces and we work together to make sure they have a great summer and experience things they might not otherwise be able to."


2/28 Post Pizza Grand Opening & TOG Social Hour

Speeding & Weight Limit Complaints: Your Options

It is a common complaint. "My road is unsafe. " We understand where you are coming from.

Please understand that New York State sets speed limits. Our Highway Superintendent & Town Board requested that the state reduce 14 of our road speed limits two years ago and are awaiting their consideration. The town is also unable to add speed bumps, due to snow clearing and driver safety.

So what can you do?

 Notify a law enforcement agency (Sheriff or State Police) and encourage them to monitor it.

Sometimes if there are numerous complaints we can use our radar speed signs, which can help remind drivers to keep their speed in check.

Weight limit restrictions are set by the Town Board. Contact our Highway Superintendent to inquire about this. Please note that the town cannot police weight restrictions. This can only be handled by law enforcement.
