debris or hazardous materials.

## Highway Dept. Road Repair & Storm Water Maintenance

This month our Highway team will be out doing crack seal repairs to town roads.

In June, they will be cleaning catch basins as part of our storm water maintenance.

#### How can I help?

Our Adopt a Roadside program is an excellent way to get involved with roadside spring cleanup. (See the story on the left.)

You can also help preserve the purity of Greenfield's water aquifer. You can prevent pollution in stormwater by:

- Conserving your water use.
- Choosing non-toxic alternatives for cleaning products.
- Reducing use of pesticides, fertilizer and irrigation in landscaping and gardening. (Excessive dirt and sand also cause pollution.)
- Properly disposing of plastics, pet waste, disinfectants, auto fluids.
- Routinely having your septic system maintained.

The first 2023 road resurfacing projects will include:

- Kilmer Road from
  Boyhaven Rd. to
  Barney Rd.
- Daniels Road from 9N to Locust Grove Rd.
- Clinton St. from City line to Daniels Rd.
- Brandell Lane from Stone Church Road to Kircher Rd.
- Allen Rd. from North Greenfield Rd. to Ballou Rd.
- Braim Rd. from Daniels Rd. to Copperfield Rd.

## Open House For One-Room Daketown Schoolhouse

The Greenfield Historical Society is holding an open house for the public to check out this piece of town history. This oneroom schoolhouse was built in 1877, after the original one burnt to the ground. Children attended from 1st through 8th grade.

It closed in 1956 and later was purchased by Chairman of Stewart's Shops, Bill Dake. Dake donated the schoolhouse to the Town of Greenfield Historical Society in 1991. It was restored to its original condition by Munter Enterprises in 2004. The schoolhouse was regularly visited by Greenfield Elementary students until the pandemic. We urge families to stop by June 10 to get a look at this beautiful piece of history.

Many original relics are inside including:

- Blackboards
- Student and teacher's desks
- The original teacher's bell, used for calling children in from recess
- A wood stove
- A water jug

- Samples of cursive writing from that time period
- A classroom map showing the country before it was settled past the Mississippi River.
- An original "4-holer" outhouse.

The Daketown Schoolhouse was the last one-room schoolhouse to close when the schools all consolidated in 1956.

Come visit on June 10 from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Historians will be onsite. The event will be held on 24 Old Daketown Rd.

## Fishing Pole Loaner Program for Residents



Go fishing this spring. You may borrow poles and equipment from Town Hall. Greenfield is part of the DEC's I FISH NY program.

Fishing licenses are available at the Town Clerk's office. They are good for 365 days from the date of purchase. Our town participates in the DEC's I FISH NY program, which offers fishing equipment for free. If you'd like to get started fishing, you can borrow spin cast rods, bobbers and hooks. You must supply the bait and **individuals 16 and older must have a valid NYS fishing license**, available at the Town Clerk's office.

Each recipient also receives a guide book of freshwater fishing regulations.

## Board Member Johnson, A 38-year Town Hall Veteran

We are very lucky to have MaryAnn Johnson representing our town as a councilperson for the past 8 years, but her history with us goes much deeper.

You might say she grew up at Town Hall, because her mom, Pauline Levo, became Town Clerk when MaryAnn was just 10 years old.

MaryAnn remembers that her mom "did a good amount of her clerk work" out of her home and was the first Town Clerk to have an office in Town Hall. The clerk was on call 24/7 to provide residents with things like hunting, fishing and marriage licenses. MaryAnn started as Deputy Clerk under her mother in 1985 and simultaneously was the Planning Board clerk and a helper in the Assessor's Office. When her mom retired in 1999 she ran for Town Clerk & Tax Collector the following year. She was the first to combine those two roles.

She truly enjoyed working the Clerk's window at Town Hall. "I've always enjoyed helping people and getting to know all of our residents," she said.

Notable advances she has been involved with include the introduction of computers in 1990, construction of the Town Hall addition and obtaining the Brookhaven Park & Golf Course in 2011.

MaryAnn would love to help complete the development of Brookhaven Park with renovated pavilions and bathrooms, and build a new Community Center to benefit all Town residents.

She currently works alongside her husband, Van, operating Adirondack Wood Products, their family business. They specialize in making wooden bowls, cutting boards, charcuterie boards, portable beverage tables and more. Check them out at adirondackwoodproducts.net.
